Curriculum Development:

Pulmonary Critical Care Fellowship 2005- 2007

Louisiana State University School of Medicine Our Lady of the Lake Regional Medical Center Baton Rouge, Louisiana

Post-Katrina, the Section of Pulmonary/Critical Care of LSUHSC in New Orleans required sites for fellow education due to loss of clinical activity in New Orleans. I facilitated a partnership with Our Lady of the Lake Regional Medical Center to bring fellows to the intensive care units at this site for clinical exposure and education and served as the director of this rotation. We developed a curriculum which took advantage of the unique opportunities at this site, including neurosurgical and trauma critical care (activities which were not previously present within the LSUHSC fellowship).

 Critical Care Rotation for Fourth Year Medical Students 2007- present Louisiana State University School of Medicine Our Lady of the Lake Regional Medical Center/Baton General Regional Medical Center Baton Rouge, Louisiana

The lack of clinical rotations post-Katrina and interest expressed by medical students in critical care led to a need for the development of additional critical care rotations. Working with the office of student affairs, I designed rotations and developed curricula for students desiring critical care electives in Baton Rouge.

 Critical Concepts Rotation for Fourth Year Medical Students 2010- present Louisiana State University School of Medicine Our Lady of the Lake Regional Medical Center/Baton General Regional Medical Center Baton Rouge, Louisiana

Critical Concepts is a required 4 week course for fourth year medical students from LSUHSC-NO. During one of the four weeks, students are required to rotate in an Intensive Care Unit. I am responsible for the coordination and education of these students which rotate in Baton Rouge.

A lecture series provided annually to incoming interns and residents at OLOLRMC. This series focuses on acute care of the hospitalized patient.
