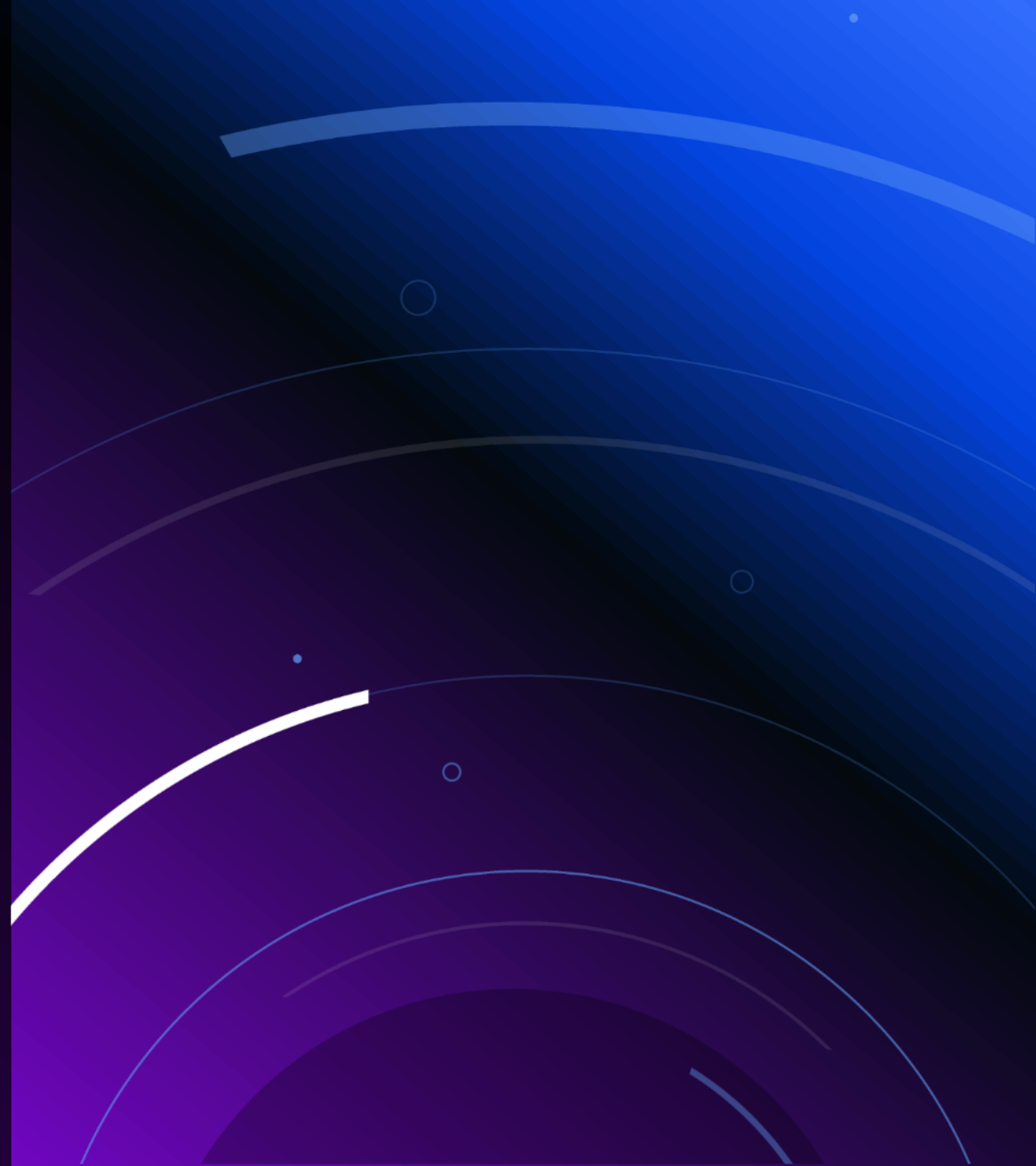

CASE #6

A 15-year-old phenotypic male presented with worsening asymptomatic gynecomastia since age 12. He denied medication or marijuana use. Examination showed a well-appearing adolescent with Tanner IV breast tissue, Tanner V pubic hair, and 3 cm mobile mass anterosuperior to the left gonad. He had noted that scrotal mass one year prior but thought it was normal. He denied any pain or changes in mass size. T was low, LH and FSH were normal. The patient underwent bilateral inguinal exploration.
